Digital Photography Exchange Connects High School Students

The Berkeley-Sakai Digital Photography Exchange is now in its fourth year. It was established in 2010 as a way to connect high school students from Berkeley and Sakai. The teachers who manage the exchange believe that art, and the art-making process, is a universal experience and that photography is a great lens for seeing into the worlds in which we live. Through photographs, students can create a shared awareness of what it means to be a teenager in the two sister cities. The combination of two modern technologies, digital photographs and the internet, allows us to create a shared experience that transcends the limits of time and space.

In previous years, the students have shared photographs on the themes of light, friendship, and their respective cities. This year's theme is *Faces of the Future, Faces of the Past*. This is a simple project that focuses on the art of the portrait and gives the students a chance to show the power of the face. The exchange will run from mid-January through mid-April. Submissions will be coordinated by the photography teachers of both schools and will be displayed in a virtual gallery on our website (<u>http://photoexchange.berkeley-sakai.org</u>). This year the photo exchange will expand the dialog between the two schools by having each student photographer provide a picture of themselves, along with their name, their age, and a message about their hope for the future. In this way we will promote the Berkeley-Sakai Sister City Association ideal of "creating a peaceful world through culture and friendship."

Schools currently participating in activities include Fremont High School and Sunnyvale Middle School in Sunnyvale and Kaho-Higashi High School, Futase Junior High School, and Igisu Elementary School in lizuka.

Sunnyvale Sister City Association hopes to eventually include all schools in Sunnyvale and lizuka in exchange activities. In February, Sunnyvale hosted a visit from Principal Kajiyama of Igisu Elementary School. During his visit, he met with school and city officials in Sunnyvale to discuss opportunities for future collaboration between schools in the two cities.
