

#### **Walnut Creek Makes 104**

Belated the news may be in making its way into this newsletter, in August 2016, the City of Santa Monica signed a friendship city agreement with its long-standing school exchange partner of Kizugawa in Japan. This made 103 sister/friendship city relationships between California and Japan.

In much the same fashion, on April 30 of this year, the City of Walnut Creek signed a partner city agreement with Tokyo's Kita Ward, with whom they have had a student exchange program for 18 years. Kita Ward Mayor Yosota Hanagawa and Ward Council Chairwoman Kanako Yamada led the delegation to Walnut Creek, where they held a signing ceremony at City Hall with Mayor Pro Tempore Justin Wedel, City Councilmember Kevin Wilk, and other dignitaries from the community. There are now 104 California-Japan sister/friendship city relationships!
